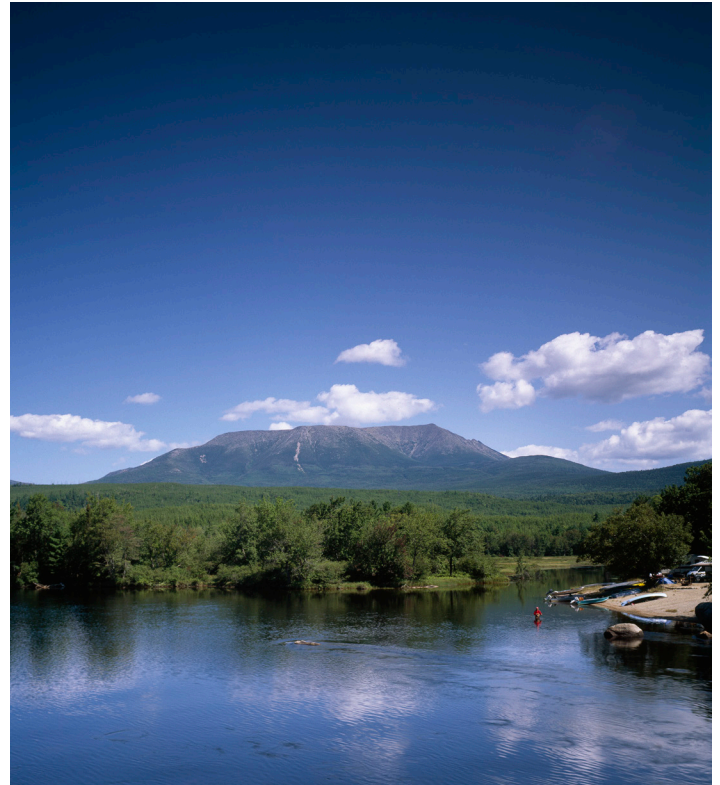
Tour departs from Portland on Thursday for two days in rural Maine including one night at the New England Outdoor Center.
