AIA | New Hampshire Architecture Foundation Awards Scholarships

Portsmouth, NH – The New Hampshire Chapter of the American Institute of Architects (AIANH) and the New Hampshire Architecture Foundation (NHAF) have announced the recipients of their jointly sponsored scholarship programs. \$1,000 grants were given to: Lindsey Buyer of Keene, NH, a third year student at Virginia Tech; Marina McIntosh of Nashua, NH, a fourth year student at Carnegie Mellon University; and, William Toohey of Rochester, NH, who is seeking his master's degree in architecture at the Wentworth Institute of Technology. Patrick Chan, a recent graduate of Salem High School, received a \$500 scholarship. He will enter Cornell University in the fall.

The AIA | NHAF Scholarships are granted to students who are currently enrolled or accepted to an accredited undergraduate or graduate professional architecture degree program and who are residents of New Hampshire. The scholarship program also accepts applications from Keene State College's undergraduate pre-professional architecture program and NHTI, Concord's CC, architecture engineering technology program. The AIA|NH Architecture Foundation scholarship program is supported in part by a grant from the AIA Component Scholarship Grant Program.

The scholarships will be presented by Dale Doller AIA, a director of the New Hampshire Architecture Foundation, at an AIANH event in Exeter, NH.
